
president's MESSAGE


PUBLICEYE ON CHARIYA ACCOUNTABILITY

Charitable giving in the United States reached \$557.16 billion in 2023, a 1.9% increase over 2022 in real dollars. However, when adjusted for inflation, giving in 2023 was 2.1% lower than the previous year.¹ Giving by individuals was down 2.4% adjusted for inflation. Unfortunately, this stagnation follows two decades of steady decline in the portion of American households that contribute to charities.²

Given that individual donors make up the bulk of charitable contributions in the United States - 75% including contributions and bequests³ – public trust in charities is as important as ever. BBB Wise Giving Alliance wants to keep an eye on charity trust and accountability priorities, as reported by the general public. With that in mind, we commissioned a survey of more than 2,100 adults in the United States exploring public positions and expectations related to a selection of charity accountability themes, including oversight, charity finances, impact, solicitation materials, artificial intelligence, and data security. Below, we share sample findings in each category. A full version of the report is available at Give.org/donortrust.

Oversight


When asked to consider the importance of assessing 7 different accountability elements, survey participants said they would most value: independent review of how the charity spends its money (76%); whether the charity's appeals are truthful, accurate, and not misleading (73%); and whether the charity adequately protects donor information (61%). Truthful communications and adequate data protection were more frequently chosen as "very important" than aspects like measurement and communication of charity achievements (57%) and adequate board oversight over staff and operations (55%). In an age of distrust, misinformation, and data vulnerability, our survey shows that truthful and accurate communication, and adequate protection of donor information, have become top public priorities.



Finances




To conduct their work, charities need to have reasonable operating and fundraising expenses. Participants were asked whether there is a minimum portion of every dollar spent by the charity that should be directed to carrying out programs before they would consider contributing to a charity. More than half (52%) said their contribution is dependent on a program expense threshold. 33% said they can make an informed decision as long as the charity is transparent; and 6.0% said the portion spent on programs is not a consideration in their giving. The most frequently chosen program expense ratio was 80% and the average ratio among all respondents was 69%.



Impact

While it has become a common assumption that donors want to support highly impactful organizations, survey results showed that the donating public does not have a clear understanding of what the term means. 2 out of 3 participants claim to know what a charity means by "impact." But, when asked to consider possible definitions for the term "charity impact," survey respondents were split about how to best define the term.

Wealthier participants were most likely to claim to know the meaning of charity impact. For example, 77% of respondents with a household income above \$200,000 said they knew the meaning of impact, as compared to 64% of participants with a household income below \$70,000. At the same time, wealthier participants who report knowing the meaning of "impact" were most divided about how to best describe the term. For example, among participants with household income above \$200K who report knowing the meaning of "impact," 23% chose "how efficient the organization was in its spending," 23% selected "achievement numbers," and only 20% selected "the overall change or outcome brought by the charity's programs in accordance with its stated mission."



Long-term results and highquality programs are valued more than short term results and high-volume programs, particularly among lower income participants.

Our results suggest there is leeway in how impact is communicated. Ultimately, charities should be clear in how they define their own impact and take comfort in knowing that people care about long-term results and quality programs.

- Rate the importance of long-term results as 9 or 10 on a 10-point scale




- Rate the importance of high-quality results as 9 or 10 on a 10-point scale

Solicitation Materials

Most participants agree that charities should ensure accuracy in their solicitation appeals and be prepared to substantiate any statements. Younger participants are less concerned about appeal accuracy, with 1 in 3 Gen Zers stating that, as long as the charity's main points are clear, they are not too concerned about accuracy in the details.

Similarly, when it comes to



solicitation appeals over social media, younger people are more likely to find the solicitation to be "very clear" or "somewhat clear." For example, 38% of Millennials say charity social media appeals are "very clear," as compared to only 14% of Matures. Engaging supporters on social media can be challenging, particularly because charities need to balance the short space limitation with the need for clarity. When donating through a social media appeal, look for a link with fuller information about the charity and intended use of your contribution.

AI

When asked to imagine a charity using AI in its information and solicitation materials, most participants describe their reaction as hesitant or negative, but there is also a significant portion with a positive or very positive reaction.

Millennials are most likely to have a positive (25%) or very positive (32%) reaction to the use of AI in charity solicitation appeals. By comparison, only 4% of Matures report a very positive reaction to the use of AI in charity solicitation appeals.


When asked to imagine charity appeals including AI-generated language, the majority of participants said they would be discouraged from giving if they knew the appeal was not verified for accuracy by a staff member. Participants from household income of \$200,000 or more are most likely to be discouraged from giving based on the use of AI-generated language. Very positive. This makes me think the charity is modern and innovative.

Positive. Al is a modern tool that can help a charity be efficient.

Hesitant. I would be skeptical of the accuracy of information in the materials.

Negative. Al causes more problems than it solves and may be a detriment.



Data Security

When asked to imagine that a charity they personally support appears in the news for being hacked and having data stolen, most people say they would hold off on donating or no longer donate. Across generations, more than 1 in 5 people (between 21% for Millennials and 24% for Gen Zers) say they would no longer donate to the charity upon learning that the charity had been hacked and data had been stolen.



Among participants who would no longer give or would withhold donations until they feel satisfied that the issue is resolved, the following actions could inspire confidence to give again: the charity sending a message informing donors of new data security improvements (28%), the charity updating its privacy policy online describing improved security measures (27%), and verification from a third party that data is secure (26%).

Canada and Beyond

BBB Wise Giving Alliance asked the same questions of more than 1,100 Canadian adults; and Canadian survey results tracked very closely to those obtained in the United States. For example, Canadian and American participants attribute very similar importance to the seven accountability elements referenced above. One factor that Canadians assigned higher importance to was "how the charity spends its money" - with 81% of Canadians stating this is a very important accountability element, as compared to 76% of Americans.

BBB Wise Giving Alliance has always recommended that people look beyond charity finances when making donation decisions. This is reflected in the broad set of issues incorporated in the BBB Charity Standards, which address charity governance, results reporting, appeal accuracy, donor privacy, and website disclosures, in addition to finances. In turn, charities seeking to increase donor confidence would be wise to be transparent across a variety of issues of donor interest, as reflected in this latest *Donor Trust Report*. How to Read the List of National Charities

he following is an alphabetical listing of the charities that are the subjects of BBB Wise Giving Alliance evaluations. The list includes organizations that have requested to be evaluated as well as those that have received the highest volume of inquiries. The BBB WGA receives inquiries through the mail, phone, e-mail and referrals from local Better Business Bureaus.

Please note the following explanations about this list:

Name Inclusion: Inclusion on this list should not be interpreted as approval or disapproval of a charity. The information in this listing is intended solely to assist donors in exercising their own judgment.



Name Omission: Omission from this list should not be interpreted as meaning that a charity meets or does not meet standards. In general, it simply means that the BBB WGA has not developed a report because it has not received recent inquiries about a charity or a charity has not requested to be evaluated.

Latest Results: This list reflects the latest charity report results as of July 17, 2024. Charity reports are available until their expiration dates, generally two years after their completion. All reports are based on the BBB Wise Giving Alliance *Standards for Charity Accountability*.

Are you looking for a national charity that's not on our list? Ask us about specific national charities not currently included. Encourage national charities we don't currently report about to contact us about enrolling online (there's never a charge for evaluation). In either way, you can help expand the list.

Note to readers about "see entry for"

Charities sometimes use several names in their materials. In some cases the variation is only slight, such as using an acronym for the full name. In other cases, the names have no self-evident connection, as, for example, the official corporate name and a name used in fund raising. In still others, different individual names may denote different programs of the same organization. This list includes all names currently used by a charity, but the evaluation status of that charity appears only under the main entry. White horizontal bars indicate an alternate name, and refer you to the evaluation listing.

Definitions for the List's Column Headings

Accredited (Met Standards) — Charities with a green check box in the first column next to their name met the 20 Standards for Charity Accountability on pages 44–45. There is no charge to charities for the accreditation evaluation.

Standards Not Met — If a charity has number codes (for example: 3, 6, 7) in the second column with a yellow X mark 🔀 that means the charity did not meet cited provision(s) of the BBB Charity Standards on pages 44–45.

Control of the sequential of the requested information or the information provided that the sequential of the requested information or the information provided was not sufficient to conclude that they met the cited standard(s).

Did Not Disclose — If a charity has a red exclamation mark **I** the charitable organization either has not responded to written BBB WGA requests for information or has declined to be evaluated in relation to the *BBB Standards for Charity Accountability*. Charity participation in the BBB WGA's review is voluntary. However, without the requested information, it is not possible to determine whether these charities adhere to all of the *BBB Standards for Charity Accountability*. The BBB WGA encourages charities to disclose accountability information beyond that typically included in financial statements and government filings, in order to demonstrate transparency and strengthen public trust in the charitable sector. The majority of national charities contacted by BBB WGA provide information and participate in the BBB WGA's evaluation program.



Q&A about BBB Wise Giving Alliance

Q How is BBB WGA different from other charity evaluators?

A BBB WGA is a **standards-based** charity monitoring organization that addresses a variety of issues besides just financial metrics. BBB Charity Standards, include, but are not limited to, such issues as: board oversight, results reporting, appeal accuracy, annual report availability, cause-related marketing disclosures, and responsiveness to donor complaints. While charity finances are important, solely focusing on them will result in an incomplete picture of a charity's accountability. See the full list of our 20 standards at the end of this *Guide*.

Q Does BBB WGA rate or grade charities?

A No. Charities are not rated against one another. A BBB WGA evaluation concludes either that a charity meets all the standards or does not meet certain ones, for reasons described in the report. Whatever the conclusion, the report does not represent approval or disapproval of the organization or its cause. BBB WGA does not suggest that prospective contributors give, or not give, to any particular organization.

Q How does the BBB WGA decide which charities to review?

A Inquiries from the public about a particular national charity prompt a BBB WGA letter requesting that the charity file information for a review. These inquiries come to us directly, by mail, phone, e-mail, and in referrals from local Better Business Bureaus. In addition, charities may file information for a review on their own initiative. In either case, BBB WGA determines whether the charity is soliciting nationally before it requests information. *There is no charge to charities for being evaluated*.

where. The seal means the national charity displaying it meets the comprehensive standards of the BBB Wise Giving Alliance.

Use of the seal is entirely voluntary. Not every national charity that meets the standards will choose to participate in the seal program. Participants sign a license agreement and pay a sliding-scale fee based on their total contributions in the past year. A national charity is eligible to apply for participation in the seal program only after an evaluation concludes that the charity meets standards. Licensing fees help BBB WGA cover its expenses.

Occasionally donors ask BBB WGA whether licensing fees influence the outcome of charity evaluations. The answer is no. Our analyst staff is very thorough for each evaluation completed. After a charity report is posted online that shows the organization meets all 20 standards, a separate marketing staff then contacts the charity to invite them to consider participating in the seal program. In addition to this separation of the analytical and licensing processes, BBB WGA ensures that seal participants are reviewed with the same frequency (every two years) as other national charities. Since the inception of the Accredited Charity Seal, about 9% of participating charities were dropped from the seal program as the charity either no longer met standards or did not provide requested updated information. BBB WGA's commitment to objectivity is unwavering. We know that the public's trust in our work is essential to our credibility.

BBB Standards for Charity Accountability

After a three-year period, drawing on independent research on donor expectations, professional and technical assistance from a variety of philanthropic experts, and numerous comments from donors and charities, the BBB Wise Giving Alliance issued the *Standards for Charity Accountability*.

The full text of the new standards, with a preface and an Implementation Guide describing how the Alliance applies them, is accessible on our website, www.give.org.

GOVERNANCE AND OVERSIGHT

The governing board has the ultimate oversight authority for any charitable organization. This section of the standards seeks to ensure that the volunteer board is active, independent and free of self-dealing. To meet these standards, the organization shall have:

1. A board of directors that provides adequate oversight of the charity's operations and its staff. Indication of adequate oversight includes, but is not limited to, regularly scheduled appraisals of the CEO's performance, evidence of disbursement controls such as board approval of the budget and fund raising practices, establishment of a conflict of interest policy and establishment of accounting procedures sufficient to safeguard charity finances.

2. A board of directors with a minimum of five voting members.

3. A minimum of three evenly spaced meetings per year of the full governing body with a majority in attendance, with face-to-face participation. A conference call of the full board can substitute for one of the three meetings of the governing body. For all meetings, alternative modes of participation are acceptable for those with physical disabilities.

4. Not more than one or 10% (whichever is greater) directly or indirectly compensated person(s) serving as voting member(s) of the board. Compensated members shall not serve as the board's chair or treasurer. [Publicly soliciting churches and other houses of worship: see the Implementation Guide at www.give.org for further information about the application of this standard.]

5. No transaction(s) in which any board or staff members have <u>material</u> conflicting interests with the charity resulting from any relationship or business affiliation. Factors that will be considered when concluding whether or not a related party transaction constitutes a conflict of interest and if such a conflict is material, include, but are not limited to: any arm's length procedures established by the charity; the size of the transaction relative to like expenses of the charity; whether the interested party participated in the board vote on the transaction; if competitive bids were sought and whether the transaction is one-time, recurring or ongoing.

MEASURING EFFECTIVENESS

An organization should regularly assess its effectiveness in achieving its mission. This section seeks to ensure that an organization has defined, measurable goals and objectives in place and a defined process in place to evaluate the success and impact of its program(s) in fulfilling the goals and objectives of the organization and that also identifies ways to address any deficiencies. To meet these standards, a charitable organization shall:

6. Have a board policy of assessing, no less than every two years, the organization's performance and effectiveness and of determining future actions required to achieve its mission.

7. Submit to the organization's governing body, for its approval, a written report that outlines the results of the aforementioned performance and effectiveness assessment and recommendations for future actions.

FINANCES

Total Expenses

This section of the standards seeks to ensure that the charity spends its funds honestly, prudently and in accordance with statements made in fund raising appeals. To meet these standards, the charitable organization shall:

Please note that standards 8 and 9 have different denominators.

8. Spend at least 65% of its <u>total expenses</u> on program activities.

Formula for Standard 8:

Total Program Service Expenses

should be at least 65%

9. Spend no more than 35% of <u>related contributions</u> on fund raising. Related contributions include donations, legacies and other gifts received as a result of fund raising efforts.

Formula for Standard 9: Total Fund Raising Expenses Total Related Contributions

should be no more than 35%

10. Avoid accumulating funds that could be used for current program activities. To meet this standard, the charity's unrestricted net assets available for use should not be more than three times the size of the past year's expenses or three times the size of the current year's budget, whichever is higher. [Meeting certain public disclosure requirements described in the Implementation Guide at www.give.org may enable a charity to satisfy this standard.] An organization that does not meet Standards 8, 9 and/or 10 may provide evidence to demonstrate that its use of funds is reasonable. The higher fund raising and administrative costs of a newly created organization, donor restrictions on the use of funds, exceptional bequests, a stigma associated with a cause and environmental or political events beyond an organization's control are among factors which may result in expenditures that are reasonable although they do not meet the financial measures cited in these standards.

11. Make available to all, on request, complete annual financial statements prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. When total annual gross income exceeds \$1,000,000, these statements should be audited in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For charities whose annual gross income is less than \$1,000,000, a review by a certified public accountant is sufficient to meet this standard. For charities whose annual gross income is less than \$250,000, an internally produced, complete financial statement is sufficient to meet this standard.

12. Include in the financial statements a breakdown of expenses (e.g., salaries, travel, postage, etc.) that shows what portion of these expenses was allocated to program, fund raising and administrative activities. If the charity has more than one major program category, the schedule should provide a breakdown for each category.

13. Accurately report the charity's expenses, including any joint cost allocations, in its financial statements. For example, audited or unaudited statements which inaccurately claim zero fund raising expenses or otherwise understate the amount a charity spends on fund raising, and/or overstate the amount it spends on programs will not meet this standard.

14. Have a board-approved annual budget for its current fiscal year, outlining projected expenses for major program activities, fund raising and administration.

FUND RAISING AND INFORMATIONAL MATERIALS

A fund raising appeal is often the only contact a donor has with a charity and may be the sole impetus for giving. This section of the standards seeks to ensure that a charity's representations to the public are accurate, complete and respectful. To meet these standards, the charitable organization shall:

15. Have solicitations and informational materials, distributed by any means, that are accurate, truthful and not misleading, both in whole and in part.

Appeals that omit a clear description of program(s) for which contributions are sought will not meet this standard.

A charity should also be able to substantiate that the timing and nature of its expenditures are in accordance with what is stated, expressed or implied in the charity's solicitations.

16. Have an annual report available to all, on request, that includes:

(a) the organization's mission statement,

- (b) a summary of the past year's program service accomplishments,
- (c) a roster of the officers and members of the board of directors,
- (d) financial information that includes:
 - (i) total income in the past fiscal year,
 - (ii) expenses in the same program, fund raising and administrative categories as in the financial statements, and
 - (iii) ending net assets.

17. Include on any charity websites that solicit contributions, the same information that is recommended for annual reports, as well as the mailing address of the charity and electronic access to its most recent IRS Form 990.

18. Address privacy concerns of donors by

- (a) providing in written appeals, at least annually, a means (e.g., such as a check off box) for both new and continuing donors to inform the charity if they do not want their name and address shared outside the organization, and
- (b) providing a clear, prominent and easily accessible privacy policy on any of its websites that tells visitors
 - (i) what information, if any, is being collected about them by the charity and how this information will be used,
 - (ii) how to contact the charity to review personal information collected and request corrections,
 - (iii) how to inform the charity (e.g., a check off box) that the visitor does not wish his/her personal information to be shared outside the organization, and
 - (iv) what security measures the charity has in place to protect personal information.

19. Clearly disclose how the charity benefits from the sale of products or services (i.e., cause-related marketing) that state or imply that a charity will benefit from a consumer sale or transaction. Such promotions should disclose, at the point of solicitation:

- (a) the actual or anticipated portion of the purchase price that will benefit the charity (e.g., 5 cents will be contributed to abc charity for every xyz company product sold),
- (b) the duration of the campaign (e.g., the month of October),
- (c) any maximum or guaranteed minimum contribution amount (e.g., up to a maximum of \$200,000).

20. Respond promptly to and act on complaints brought to its attention by the BBB Wise Giving Alliance and/or local Better Business Bureaus about fund raising practices, privacy policy violations and/or other issues. BBB Wise Giving Alliance 3033 Wilson Boulevard, Suite 710 Arlington, VA 22201
